## 2024 Bad Medicine Lake AIS inspection facts:

- In 2024, Becker County budgeted 500 hours of inspector time for Bad Medicine Lake. In 2024, 950 inspection hours were completed. Inspections began on 5/11. A 7-day-per-week schedule began 5/27 and continued through late August. Inspections continued through Labor Day 2024. 500 inspection hours have been allocated for the 2025 season.
- 2. The total number of inspections was 1292. 824 (63.7%) were on entry and 468 (36.3%) on exit.
- 3. May 11 was the busiest day with 38 inspections. 60 inspections were completed of the fishing opener weekend.
- 4. For the summer, Saturday was the busiest day of the week with 342 inspections followed by Sunday (318), Friday (187) and Monday (132).
- 5. For the summer, weekly inspection numbers were consistent from the fishing opener until the end of July and then dropped off substantially in August.
- 6. Fishing boats accounted for 77% of inspections followed by runabouts/ski boats (6.4%), pontoons (6.3%) canoes/kayaks (3%), personal watercraft (3.5%), wake boats (1%), and docks/lifts (<1%).
- 7. State of registration was overwhelmingly Minnesota (82%) followed by North Dakota (10%), and then 15 other states totaling about 8%.
- 8. For the 2024 inspection season, only 2 of 824 (.28%) of the boats entering Bad Medicine were found to have drain plugs in place on arrival. Inspectors found and removed plants, water or mud from 6 entering watercrafts (.75%).
- 9. No zebra mussels were detected by inspectors in 2024.
- 10. No referrals for decontamination were made from the Bad Medicine public access in 2024.
- 11. 22% of entering boaters reported last using their watercraft on a designated infested waterbody.
